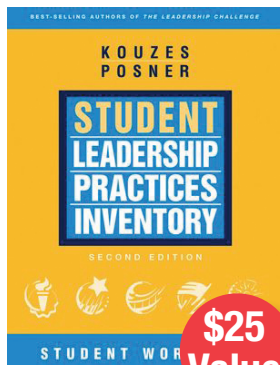
Youth and Adviser Trainings

Phase II: Capitol Leadership is four days of intense leadership training, meetings, planning, and activities designed for the ultimate leadership experience. The 2009–2010 chapter and state officers will have the opportunity to participate in public policy development, advocacy training, team development, the *Student Leadership Practices Inventory* by James M. Kouzes and Barry Z. Posner, as well as a self-guided tour of our nation's capital. Officers will have the opportunity to meet with their Congressional representatives of the Federal government to discuss current issues and concerns.

Chapter and state officers will also join the newly elected national officers in working together to serve the needs of thousands of members and chapters across the country. The leadership development theme of Phase II concentrates on the critical career skills students need. Through Family and Consumer Sciences (FACS) education and USA Phase II, student leaders will experience the critical training needed to encourage quality participation and growth of FCCLA membership.

Leadership isn't just for chapter and state officers, it's for advisers too! Professional development sessions give advisers the tools they need to help chapter and state officers apply the USA training at home. Meeting Registration Policies

- All individuals attending any part of the meeting and/or meal functions must be registered. Family members and non-advisers who are chaperones must also register for the meeting.
- Students may not register without an adult chaperone. FCCLA will not provide chaperones.
- Hotel reservations are made by FCCLA for each person registered for the meeting. If you would like to extend your stay you must contact the hotel directly. The hotel rate is \$179 (plus tax), per room, per night.

- Arrival is Wednesday, September 30, 2009 and departure is Saturday, October 3, 2009.
- Registrations must be completed online **BY September 1, 2009**. Registrations submitted **AFTER September 1, 2009** will incur a \$50 per person late fee.
- If roommate names are not listed, FCCLA will charge for the appropriate occupancy. FCCLA will not match roommates.
